# **Coaching & Games**

Roland Rodgers took over the onerous job as Coaching and Games in the club last November. When everything in the club is stripped away its about games and coaching. Everything else in the club revolves around the organisation of games and the coaching of players. It is the foundation of our club and everything else ewe are involved in revolves around our games. We are blessed to have in Roland a totally Committed and Organised Coaching Officer.

Our Club was chosen as one of two clubs in The County to benefit from a County Board Coaching initiative for underage players. Roland has liaised with Donal Daly and Terence Houlihan all year on this initiative and an amount of work has gone in to it.

# Coaching Committee Report 2018: by Roland Rodgers, Coaching Officer.

**2018** has been another hugely successful one, not only on the field of play, but also in terms of our player participation and our overall standard of coaching within our club. Great strides have been made in the area of coaching recently compared to the "primitive" practices of coaching of yesteryear. This progress and improving standards in coaching is very much down to the enthusiasm, endeavour and willingness of each and every one of our coaches in Ballymacelligott GAA Club.

So, at the outset, I would like to take the opportunity to thank each and every coach for their co-operation, for their determination and for their voluntary efforts throughout the year. Without our volunteers, the club would simply not function and these volunteers take it upon themselves to commit time and energy to promote our games amongst the youth of our parish and most do it in a discreet, caring and distinguished manner. The club is greatly indebted to all our coaches.

Academy: A credit to all our coaches at our Nursery who oversaw the running of our very successful Academy on every Sunday. Not only were the basic fundamentals and footballing skills demonstrated to our young intrepid enthusiasts, there was also an overall sense of engagement, enjoyment and positivity evident during the year. February saw the Academy for our U-6s begin in St. Brendan's Hall and then we progressed out onto the playing fields when the weather eventually improved. Our Under 8s have made significant progress with their footballing skills due in no small measure to the guidance and direction of our coaching team. Once again, the Academy was a hive of activity every Sunday morning with our Under 8s attending in huge numbers and the quality of coaching delivered was impressive to say the least. Ball familiarisation and Basic movement skills were honed in on and our Under 8s also participated in many Go Games Blitzes throughout the year and they distinguished themselves ever so well on each occasion. The Under 10s have mirrored the improvement and progress of the other age

groups, again due to the magnificent standard of coaching delivered at this age group. It is evident that the coaches prepare meticulously for each coaching session and this translates in a positive manner to our young players. They too participated in many Go Games Blitzes around the County and we can all be proud of their exploits on the field of play. Míle Buíochas once again to all our Academy Coaches.

**Coaching Committee 2018:** consisted of John Leen, John Rice, Jer Lynch, Tony Silles, Stephen O Brien, James Godley and Roland Rogers. We met on no fewer than nine times during the year with the purpose of overseeing the continuing improvement in the standard of coaching within our Club. Some new initiatives were started. On 24<sup>th</sup> June, we organised a "Come Play with Me" theme in our academy whereby we invited at least one parent to "shadow" their child while the coaching session took place under the stewardship of our coaches. This was hugely successful and we hope to stage another few in the coming season.

Another departure was staging a **skills** test amongst our Under 10s, Under 12s and Under 14s in which each youngster was tested on the basic skills of Gaelic Football, including solo, pick up, hop, shooting off left and right foot, punt kick, hook kick etc. This exercise proved to be one of an "eye-opener" as some of the basic skills were not executed correctly. An area to work on, no doubt. These players will again go through the same **assessment** next spring to gauge improvement. We need to be "Best at Basics".

The club also used a **drone** to film an U-16 match at the end of June. The purpose of this exercise was to demonstrate to our players the areas where they could improve during a match scenario. It essentially was a type of video analysis. It was a fruitful exercise which may be used in future to aid our coaching and feedback to players.

At the moment, players born in 2002,03,04 and 05 have been attending **strength and conditioning** sessions at the Centre of Excellence, Currans every Sunday morning under the instruction of our senior player Cian Counihan. The feedback from the youngsters has been truly positive and they are highly impressed with the quality of instruction from one of our esteemed own. Cian has been ever so cooperative and helpful and we are delighted to have secured both Cian's services and indeed the Centre of Excellence for these sessions. October, November and January have been set aside for S&C sessions in order to prepare our youngsters for the 2019 playing season.

**Goalkeeping** Coaching courses were also organised in spring by Joby Costello and by Gary Kissane and these sessions were attended by some oy our Juvenile keepers. The Coaching of Goalkeepers is an area where I believe the club has neglected in recent times and greater attention is needed in this area in the coming months and years.

Michéal Quirke from the County Board also visited the club on a number of occasions during the year to help and facilitate coaching in our club. Tuesday Feb 27<sup>th</sup> saw his first visit when Micheál gave a visual presentation to the coaches. On April 9<sup>th</sup>, Micheál delivered a practical session to our coaches in St Brendan's Hall working on Ball Familiarisation, Basic Movement Skills etc. He also gave a coaching session to our U-12s in July and to our U-14s in August. There were many Coaching Education Courses staged throughout Springtime with William Harmon, Niall O Mahony, John Dillon all delivering various different coaching courses at different venues in the county. There courses were well attended by our coaches and mentors and I would hope that this good practice will continue in 2019 when all coaches will get the opportunity to be upskilled .

# Club Gathering and Open Forum.... "Your Parish....Your Club....Your Say"

Unfortunately, and due to unforeseen circumstances, our planned Club Gathering at the Ballygarry House Hotel scheduled for Saturday Oct 20<sup>th</sup> was cancelled. Work on this gathering began back on 19<sup>th</sup> Dec 2017 and having met with Terence Houlihan County Coaching Officer and Donal Daly of the County Board on numerous occasions, it was designed to help keep our Community vibrant and alive with emphasis on our local GAA club. Emphasis would have been placed on recruiting new members to the club, be they coaches mentors, admin workers etc and on trying to sell and promote our club within our parish and beyond. We also wanted to display the plans of our proposed new dressing rooms at this event. Great work was done in the background by our committee ( Oonagh Rahilly, Fionnán Fitzgerald, Jer Lynch, Maureen O Shea, John Rice, Stephen O Brien, Noelle O Brien and Roland Rogers ) Posters, Flyers etc were printed advertising the event and a decision was made to postpone the event until the new year. We are thinking of scheduling our Gathering after Ballymac Strictly Come Dancing as we can advertise it once agin at Strictly in January.

#### **Coach Education**

After a spectacular year for the club at all age groups, it is almost time to look to the year ahead. Now, the onus is on us all as coaches and mentors to avail of the very many coach education courses that will come on stream in the coming months. These courses are organised and facilitated by the County Board, primarily to assist and guide new and upcoming coaches. It is now a requirement that each coach undergoes Garda Vetting ( which is done online ), attend the Children First Programme, complete the Basic Foundation Level Coaching Course and to read, sign and follow the Code of Behaviour. These all exist to safeguard both ourselves and the children who are under our care. We would hope that every coach in our club would have satisfied these requirements and no doubt the officers of our club would be only too willing to assist and guide any volunteer through these requirements.

Our end of season review of all age groups at Coiste na nÓg will take place shortly and again we will consider all feedback, concerns, suggestions, proposals and advise from team coaches and mentors. The club is already following Best Practice in the area of Coaching and it is hoped that this good practice will continue for the forthcoming year.

At all age groups we are blessed with numbers allowing us to enter three U12 teams, two U14 teams and an U16 team in this year's County League and Central Region competitions.

In 2018 we enjoyed success at county league level winning Division 4 of the County League while our U12 teams won medals in both Phase 1 and Phase 2 of the county league and Central region. Being a team that lies on the outskirts of Tralee and on the gate way to Castleisland we take immense pride in entering competitions in Tralee and Castleisland Districts. This year we won medals in both regions progressing to the final of the Rose Cup U13 Competition as well as winning the A final of the U14 Castleisland District.

In 2018 we had two players with the U14 County Development squad: Donal Daly and Luke O'Connell plus James Bailey and Adam Joy were part of the U15 County Development squad. Our Coiste na nÓg Coach Kieran Savage was part of the Kerry U14 County Development Coaching team in 2018.

The Ladies Club stated their first competition on the 12th March 2012 when they took on Corcha Dhuibhne at under 12 level and beat them!!! ## Ladies Report from James Godley, Chairman of Ballymac Ladies Club:

## **Academy**

Our academy players as with any club, this is the starting point in a career of any young aspiring footballer and again with out people like Kieran, Tim and Padráig O'Connor, Roy Geary, John and Kevin Leen, TJ Casey, Sheila Ann O'Rahilly, Bridget Leen and Maureen O Shea, and others who's involvement ensured that these academy players had a great time learning about football and developing their skills and having fun we as a club be in a poorer position only for the help of these people, we as the ladies club thank you for your time and dedication to the youngest members of our club.

Ballymac Academy 2018 for the U10 Girls began in the training pitch on 11th March. Although conditions under foot were a bit soft for the first few weeks, the girls made the most of it. After a few weeks we moved to the Main pitch and the weather improved significantly. From the off the numbers attending remained between 10 to 15 and their attendance was very good. The make up of the team saw only two girls from the previous years U10 panel compete with us making us a very young team. We saw some new players join this year and they were welcomed into the group as if they had been there training from under six. This should encourage any girls wanting to join the team, you will always be made feel welcome by Club, Mentors and Kids. The move up from Under 8 to under 10 involved a notable switch from fun based games to more skill based games but keeping that element of fun in each session. The girls developed significantly on a skill level from the beginning of the year to the end of the year. Achieving this improvement was in no small part down to the three coaches, with at least two in attendance each Sunday and it is this continuity that proved key to advancing the girls development. At this age level we played a lot of fun games with other clubs, namely Austin Stacks, Kerins o Rahillys, Firies, Abbeydorney, Na Gaeil & Kilcummin. Some of the fore mentioned we played twice and three times. This season was the girls first introduction to field positions in a more competitive environment. In the early season Games we struggled against teams who were predominantly made up of 9 & 10 year olds who had previous experience at this age level to call on. Due to academy restructuring, the U10 Girls were joined by the older of the U8 girls in late July and these girls, although some two and even three years younger than their counterparts, blended into the team very well. We competed in a few blitz and gave a great account of ourselves not only in football but also in attitude on and off the pitch. Our finest moment of the season came when we went to Currans centre of excellence to compete in a charity U10 Blitz on a wet dour day in October. The game began feisty and was close but come the second half when both teams adapted a more football approach the girls ended the season on a very positive note running out comfortable winners.

#### **U12 REPORT:**

Our u12 girls began training last January in preparation for the 2018 season. Due to a large panel of girls two teams were entered in both North Kerry and County League competitions. The first competition of the year was the North Kerry League.

The Blue team playing in Division One had victories over Abbeydorney and Desmonds before our final game against Austin Stacks which would decide who would be outright winners. On the night the Tralee girls emerged victorious by two points after a tight game.

Later in the year we defeated Desmonds in the Shield Final following a very exciting encounter.

Our Gold side also participated in the North Kerry League and had games against Ballyduff Austin Stacks Abbeydorney Dingle and Finuge/St Senans.

Following the completion of the group games we qualified for a Shield Final against Dingle in which our girls came out on top.

In the County League the Gold team were included in a Division with Beaufort Ballyduff Dingle Spa ISG and Currow where they won two of their games but more importantly all girls wishing to play football got regular games over the Summer and showed great improvement with every game they played. The Blue team competed in Division One of the Co League with old rivals Austin Stacks first up with the town sides ability to strike for goals proving the difference on the night.

Our next fixture saw us travel to Caherciveen to take on Southern Gaels who had been the dominant team at u12 level over the past number of years knowing that anything less than a win would see our hopes of Co League glory evaporate. However the team showed great character and resolve to achieve a one point victory on a 2-12 to 3-8 scoreline.

This victory gave the girls great confidence and wins over Beaufort, Miltown/Listry, Rathmore and ISG saw them qualify for the Co Final, even though they lost their final round game away to Cromane.

In the final played in John Mitchels on the 24th of June once again we encountered Austin Stacks who entered the game as favourites due to winning all their group games, some by considerable margins.

However on the night from the first whistle our girls took the game by the scruff of the neck and playing some excellent football throughout ran out deserving winners on a 4-10 to 1-9 scoreline thus creating history by becoming the first girls team from the Club to win a Division One Co League title.

The final competition for the girls was the Coiste Tra Li League which was run on a Blitz format which saw us defeat Kerins O Rahillys in the final.

Overall a very successful year for the girls who throughout the year were a credit to the Club and their families both on and off the field.

The 2018 season began on February 25th on a cold Sunday morning on the beach in Banna. All the signs were good and from there everyone rolled up their sleeves for following few weeks to get in shape for the county league which was the main focus for the season.
